Nursery Gets A Boost

The Green Thumbs Community Nursery has received a real boost with the announcement that the Victorian Government will provide \$50,000 for the venture.

This exciting project is a collaboration between the Girgarre Development Group, the Friends of Gargarro and the Girgarre Community Group. The existing Green Thumbs Nursery at The Cottage will be relocated to the new site, adjacent to the Gargarro Botanic Garden.

The rock pad for the nursery compound was laid some weeks ago and is clearly visible from Winter Road.

A project committee comprising representatives from all the organisations involved has been established and met on site recently to plan the way forward.

A storage and work shed will be the first structure to be completed, to be followed by the erection of a chain mesh security fence.

Rail Trail

IT'S taken 10 years, countless local volunteers and thousands of dollars, but the Girgarre-Stanhope Rail Trail has entered the final stretch. And with weather, funding and a worldwide viral pandemic permitting, the large-scale project is estimated to be completed by the end of 2021. Initially thought up as a pipedream by a few Girgarre locals looking to restore the old railway station more than a decade ago, it has since transformed into an all-encompassing effort to bridge the gap between two communities.

I hope this finds you all well, healthy, happy and warm. I have started writing this several times, with the plan of sharing our reopening schedule and then the second wave of the pandemic hit Melbourne and lockdown suburbs began, leaving me confused and bewildered about what we are going to do. Our Seniors will resume on Tuesday the 14 of July in a modified format 10.30am-12.30pm. No food will be able to be shared, so we will continue with our community

meals as takeaway and delivery for those that are unable to attend or who are not allowed due to our 10 people in the Utility room rule.

At this stage the Nursery will be reopening later this month; please follow our Face Book page or ring to enquire for further details.

I literally just heard that Victoria is now in a lock down with all borders closed. Crazy times people and you can see why I have been hesitant to plan our reopening. It was suggested this morning that we wait until August the 1st and this may be the case in the coming days, but for now we will stick to our plan of July 13.

If you are unsure of what is happening with our groups and events please contact us on 5854 6482.

Our mowing program continues, as it has done over the last three months and I must acknowledge the tremendous effort and dedication of Ron Barkla. Without Ron this program would have ceased to operate many months ago.

Food relief and community meals are continuing and we ask when possible if you require food relief to ring us beforehand to organise a collection time

Our library will also reopen on the 13 of July, with new quarantine processes in place for items returned.

On a personal note, I took my boys and Mum on a little road trip on Friday, (with most of the population I think!) After a request from Clarry to do "something exciting" on the holidays and with options very limited. We decided to go to Colbinabbin silos, Heathcote Pink Cliffs and Rochester silos and The Shamrock for lunch. Yes we did have to book, but not eating out since February, it was a nice treat.

Australian Consolidated Milk wins Dairy Industry Association of Australia Honour

Australian Consolidated Milk has taken out top honours for its skim milk powder at the Dairy Industry Association of Australia product competition.

WHILE the world's athletes will have to wait until next year for a Tokyo Olympic medal, striking gold in dairy has not been delayed by the coronavirus pandemic.

Australian Consolidated Milk has won the gold medal for its skim milk powder at this year's Dairy Industry Association of Australia product competition.

The factory also received a silver for its salted butter, unsalted butter, whole milk powder and buttermilk powder.

This was the first year ACM was eligible for the awards as it started processing milk at its Girgarre factory last year.

"This is truly a fantastic result and is a true reflection of the quality and care which goes into all of our products," ACM chief operating officer Jason Limbrick said.

Judging for the 2020 DIAA competition was held in March and included multiple entries from across the country.

An awards luncheon was scheduled a fortnight ago but was postponed due to the coronavirus lockdown.



To compensate for this delay, the DIAA informed the gold and silver award winners of their success last week.

New Industry Reports

ACM John Hommes reported that the electrical work is being undertaken at this time and the company will start commissioning cheese plant mid-July. John reported that the cheese makers have started their employment on the 29th June. The factory will produce both organic and regular cheese in bulk 20kg boxes. John said that smaller quantities will be available sometime in the future. John said that opening prices have been firm and that they have retained all their suppliers as well as signing up a few new ones.

Bio digester Ian Burtram reported that an onsite meeting with AGIG at the factory site on Curr Road had to be cancelled due to Covid 19.

Kilter Callum Gunn reported that Kilter had completed direct drilling of 130 hectares with an expectation that 100,000s will be added to the Girgarre landscape.

Irrigation System Park Craig Rowden from the Campaspe Shire reported the design for the automatic watering system has been completed. We have negotiated to include lawn on the eastern side of car park.

Adrian Western reported on the new funding policy recently introduced by the Campaspe council concerning community grants.

Open Gardens Lorraine Warde reported that the Open Gardens Committee is still working towards the October date for Open Gardens: a final decision to postpone will be made in July. \$750 was received from the Campaspe Council community grants program.

Hall Committee Dennis reported that Hall Committee has received a \$5000 grant from the Gardiner Foundation to install a gas heater in the supper room. Shire have been notified of plans and heater will be installed as soon as funds are allocated from funding body. Planning has commenced re reopening of the Girgarre Hall and Supper room.

Rec Reserve Greg Fitzpatrick reported on a proposed new Facilities Group which could be created after the withdrawal by the government of section 86, which was in place to manage halls and recreation reserves. It is proposed that this new group will be formed to manage both the Recreation Reserve and the Memorial Hall.

Land Care Bernie Fitzpatrick reported that Stanhope Girgarre Landcare has finally been affiliated with Landcare Victoria which will allow our local group to seek funding for future plantings. Bernie reported that direct drilling has occurred along the Rail Trail. Bernie also reported that the Rail Trail is making great progress with the fencing project along the old railway line to Stanhope.

Kindergarten Sally Canny reported that 5, 5-year olds and 7, 3-year olds are presently enrolled. All children have received their kinder shirts thanks to the Girgarre RSL & the Stanhope Lions Club.

Moosic Muster Recent spike in Covid is very concerning re the January 2021 Muster – plans are still happening however if January is still a risk April 2021 is also in consideration. Muster received a \$4000 grant from the Campaspe Shire Community Grants Round 1.

Market There will be no market in July. Our market will recommence when the market team is able to manage the regulations that Govt require to hold such events.

Jigarre Jammin Irene reported that another very successful Jigarre Jammin session was held via zoom. Feedback for this program was extremely positive with participants zooming in from across the state.



But perhaps we all have learnt similar things.

Distance makes the heart grow fonder.

Team work is essential, even if from a distance.


